Glossary of Terms

SMRR	Supplier Material Rejection Report or Quality Rejection
DMR	Discrepant Material Rejection or Material Rejection
SCB	Supplier Chargeback. This can be associated with an SMRR or DMR
8D	8 Discipline Report. Form JCI uses to document corrective actions
4D	Partial 8D report showing containment activities and identifying probable root causes

Supplier IRIS FAQ

Question: Do Suppliers have access to IRIS?

Answer: At this time, Suppliers do not have access to IRIS. All communication from the Suppliers have to be entered by the person creating the issue. This could be your Quality contact or your Materials contact at the receiving Plant.

Question: Will IRIS replace the current Supplier Quality and Supplier Materials performance reporting systems?

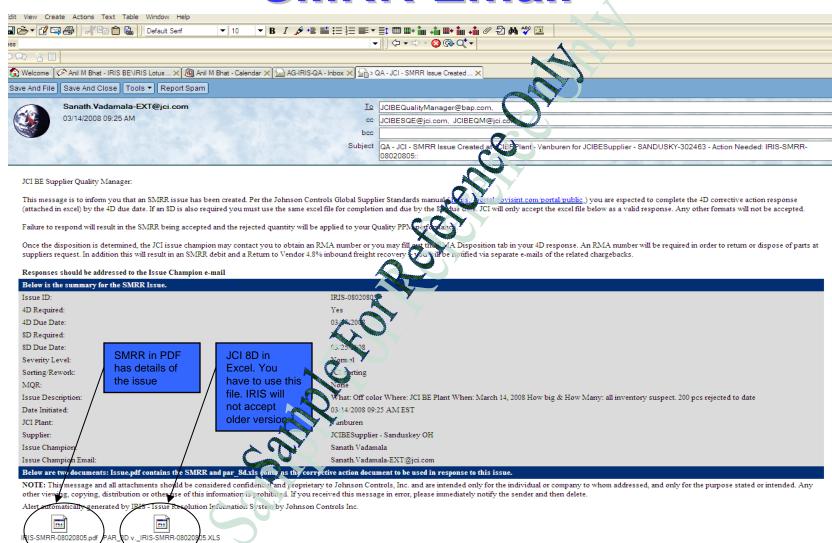
Answer: Yes. IRIS will replace all current JCI Supplier Quality and Supplier Materials performance reporting systems.

Question: How can suppliers dispute SMRRs, DMRs and Chargebacks?

Answer: Suppliers can dispute SMRRs, DMRs and Chargebacks via email only. They may also choose to follow up a dispute with a meeting with the Plant personnel and JCI Purchasing Buyer responsible.

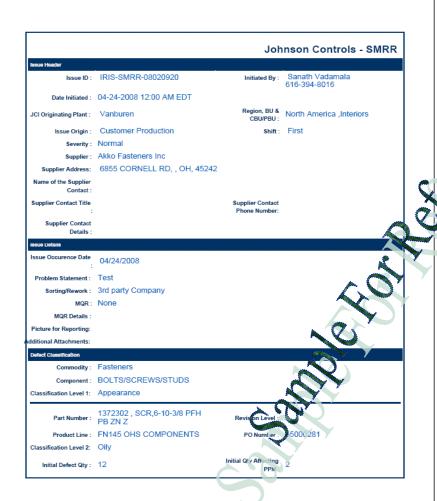


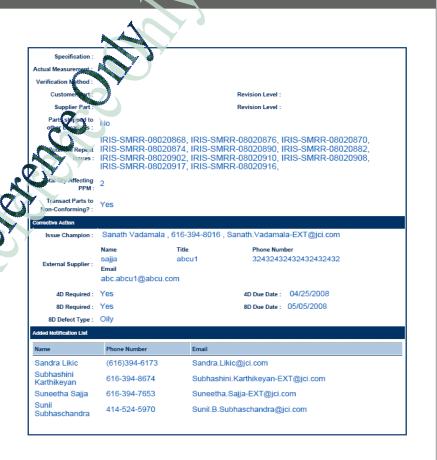
SMRR Email





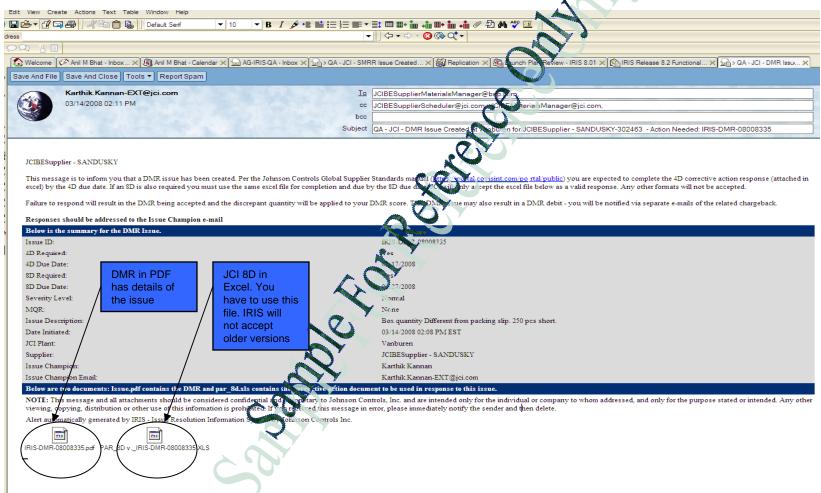
SMRR Example







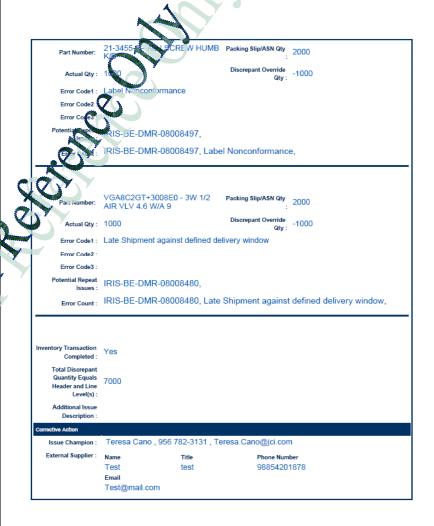

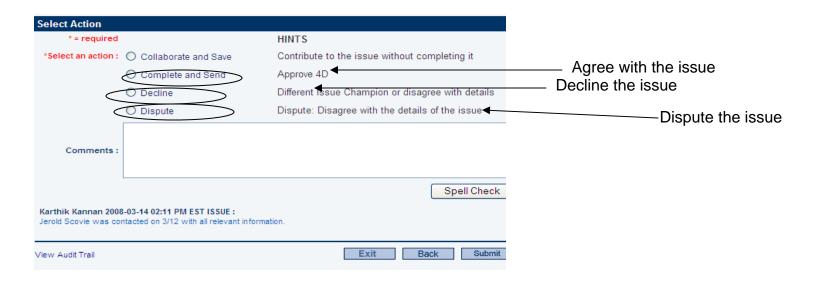


Do's & Don'ts for SMRR & DMRs

- + Always keep your Plant contact information updated with the JCI Plants.
- + Always respond back in a timely manner. 24 hours for 4D & 7 Business days for Planned 8D.
- + Always respond back using the 8D file attached to the email (Save this to your system as the new version). IRIS will not accept older version.
- + Always maintain a log for SMRRs along with dates & names of people communicated with. Retain a copy of the email for your log.
- + You may attach supporting documents. IRIS does allow attaching supporting document.
- Delays in responding will result in hit to your 8D rating & escalation within JCI & your leadership. You can request more time to close an 8D provided you submit the planned 8D on time (within 7 business days).



Dos & Don'ts for SMRR & DMRs

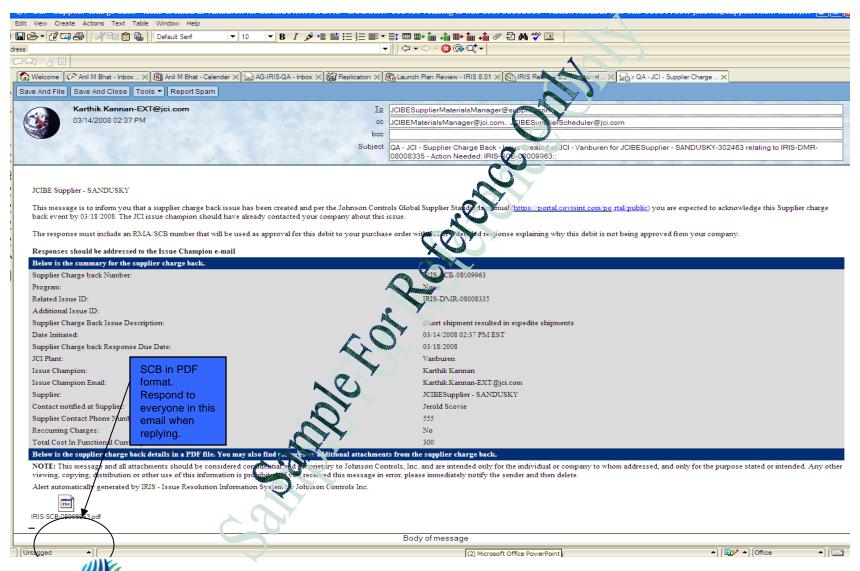


When Responding to SMRRs or DMRs via email your options are:

- Agree that the issue is yours & submit 4 D or containment action using the 8D form
- Decline giving reason for same. This could be a case where the issue was sent in error. Example: Tools no longer with you & has moved to another supplier.
- 3. Dispute, because you do not agree with the issue. Please give explanation for dispute
- PS: You have to respond using the attached 8D form even if you disagree or dispute the SMRR or DMR.

Dos & Don'ts for SCB

- + Always respond to SCB (Chargebacks) in a timely manner. If you need to escalate this within your organization, it is your responsibility to do so when you receive the notification
- + Failure to respond to SCBs within the time frame stipulated in the email will result in escalation to JCI Purchasing Buyer group(s)
